**INTRODUCTION**

The County of Roanoke, Virginia, on behalf of Roanoke County Public Schools (RCPS), is seeking proposals and qualifications from Offerors to provide high volume copier services, in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications as set out in this Request for Proposal (RFP). The RFP and related documents may be obtained during normal business hours from the Purchasing Division, (540) 772-20261. This document may be viewed and/or downloaded from the County of Roanoke Purchasing Division's Current Bid Opportunities website at <https://www.roanokecountyva.gov/bids.aspx>. If you have any problems accessing the documents, you may contact Purchasing at (540) 772-2061 or [KHoyt@roanokecountyva.gov](mailto:KHoyt@roanokecountyva.gov).

Proposals, to be considered and evaluated, must be received on or before 2:00 p.m. on May 4, 2020. Proposals appropriately received will be opened at this time. **Proposals received after 2:00 p.m. will not be accepted or considered.** The time of receipt shall be determined by the time clock stamp in the Purchasing Office, or if it is not working, such time shall be determined by the Purchasing official who is to open the proposals. Faxed or e-mailed proposals are not acceptable.

Each proposal must be appropriately signed by an authorized representative of the Offeror. Two (2) digital copies of the proposal, one as submitted, and one **redacted to remove all confidential and proprietary material** (if applicable), must be included in the proposal submission.

## **SECTION 1. PURPOSE.**

The purpose of this Request for Proposal (RFP) is the procurement of a contract to provide high volume copier services consistent with the terms and conditions herein set forth. Final scope of services will be negotiated with the successful Offeror.

## **SECTION 2. BACKGROUND.**

## **SECTION 3. INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFERORS.**

- A. Proposals must be submitted in accordance with the instructions and requirements contained in this RFP, including the Introduction. Failure to do so may result in the proposal being considered non-responsive and it may be rejected. An Offeror must promptly notify the Purchasing Division of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or error which may be discovered upon examination of the RFP. An Offeror requiring clarification or interpretation of this RFP should contact Kate Hoyt at [KHoyt@roanokecountyva.gov](mailto:KHoyt@roanokecountyva.gov).
- B. Until such time that an award is published, direct contact with any County employee without the express permission of the Purchasing Manager or designated representative, on the subject of this proposal, is strictly forbidden. Violation of this Instruction may result in disqualification of Offeror's proposal.
- C. Prospective Offerors, sometimes referred to as providers, operators, contractors, consultants, or vendors, are to address the criteria below at a minimum as part of their submitted proposal. Each proposal should include a transmittal letter and management overview of the proposal. Proposals are to include and may be evaluated on the following factors, together with such other factors as will protect and preserve the interests of the County of Roanoke, which may also be considered.

- 1. Organizational structure of firm and qualifications of management personnel.

Prospective Offerors should submit at a minimum the length of time in the business, corporate experience, strengths in the industry, business philosophy, and a description of the organizational structure of the firm; a description of the

organizational structure for the management and operation of the services requested and/or provision of the items referred to in this RFP, including an organizational chart denoting all positions and the number of personnel in each position. (See Attachment B)

2. Financial condition of the firm and ability to perform all obligations of any resultant contract.

The sufficiency of the financial resources and the ability of the Offeror to comply with the duties and responsibilities described in this RFP. Each Offeror shall provide a current annual financial report and the previous year's report and a statement regarding any recent or foreseeable mergers or acquisitions. Financial statements may be marked as "confidential" in accordance with the requirements set out in Section 4(A) of this RFP. (See Attachment B)

3. Each Offeror is to state whether or not any of Offeror's owners, officers, employees, or agents, or their immediate family members, is currently, or has been in the past year, an employee of the County of Roanoke or has any responsibility or authority with the County that might affect the procurement transaction or any claim resulting therefrom. If so, please state the complete name and address of each such person and their connection to the County of Roanoke. Each Offeror is advised that the Ethics in Public Contracting and Conflict of Interests Act of the Virginia Code, as set forth in Section 4 of this RFP, apply to this RFP. (See Attachment B)
4. Experience in providing the services and/or items requested by this RFP. (See Attachment B)
5. Price.  
Prospective Offerors must submit the price such Offeror proposes to charge the County for providing the required services and/or items, including all fees and costs and how they are calculated. (See Attachment B)
6. The ability, capacity, and skill of the Offeror to provide the services and/or items described in this RFP and in a prompt and timely manner without delay or interference.
7. The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience, efficiency and effectiveness of the Offeror.
8. The quality and timeliness of performance of previous contracts or services of the nature described in this RFP.
9. Compliance by the Offeror with laws and ordinances regarding prior contracts, purchases, or services. (See Attachment B)
10. The conditions, if any, of the proposal. (See Attachment B)



11. Prospective Offerors should submit, at a minimum, a description of the marketing approach and promotions they intend to pursue to maximize revenues generated from the services or items requested in this RFP. Provide examples of any promotions or promotional materials. (See Attachment B)
- D. Each Offeror should provide the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of at least three (3) references in connection with supplying the services or items requested in this RFP, especially from other **local government** operations similar to those being requested in this RFP by the County. Each reference should include organizational name, official address, contact person, title of contact, and phone number. (See Attachment B)
- E. Also include any other materials you may want to submit as part of your proposal response.
- F. Responses to this RFP must be in the prescribed format (Attachment B – Proposal Response and Checklist).
- Offeror shall provide one redacted copy of its proposal fit for public dissemination, in the event the County must respond to a Freedom of Information Act request. Two (2) digital copies of the proposal, one as submitted, and one **redacted to remove all confidential and proprietary material**, must be included in the proposal submission. Offeror shall not mark its entire proposal as confidential and/or redact the entire proposal; doing so may result in the disqualification of Offeror's proposal.
- G. The County may request additional information, clarification, or presentations from any of the Offerors after review of the proposals received.
- H. The County has the right to use any or all ideas presented in reply to this RFP, subject only to the limitations regarding proprietary/confidential data of Offeror.
- I. The County is not liable for any costs incurred by any Offeror in connection with this RFP or any response by any Offeror to this RFP. The expenses incurred by Offeror in the preparation, submission, and presentation of the proposal are the sole responsibility of the Offeror and may not be charged to the County.
- J. Only the County will make news releases pertaining to this RFP or the proposed award of a Contract.
- K. Each Offeror who is a stock or Nonstock Corporation, Limited Liability Company, business trust, or a limited partnership or other business entity shall be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth of Virginia as a domestic or foreign business entity if required by law. Each such Offeror shall include in its proposal response the Identification Number issued to it by the Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC) and should list its business entity name as it is listed with the SCC. Any Offeror that is not required to be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a domestic or foreign business entity as required by law shall include in its proposal response a statement describing why the Offeror is not required to be so authorized. (See Va. Code Section 2.2-4311.2).

- L. Each Offeror is required to disclose if it has ever been debarred, fined, had a contract terminated, or found not to be a responsible bidder or Offeror by any federal, state, or local government, and/or private entity. If so, please give the details of each such matter and include this information with the proposal response.

#### SECTION 4. MISCELLANEOUS.

- A. Ownership of Material - Ownership of all data, materials, and documentation originated and prepared for the County pursuant to the RFP shall belong exclusively to the County and be subject to public inspection in accordance with the *Virginia Freedom of Information Act*. Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by the Offeror shall not be subject to public disclosure under the *Freedom of Information Act*, unless otherwise required by law. **However, the Offeror must invoke the protection of Section 2.2-4342(F) of the Code of Virginia, in writing, either before or at the time the data or other material is submitted. The written notice must SPECIFICALLY identify the data or materials to be protected and state the reason why protection is necessary. The proprietary or trade secret material submitted must be identified by some distinct method such as highlighting or underlining and must indicate only the specific words, figures, or paragraphs that constitute trade secret or proprietary information.** The classification of an entire proposal document, line item prices, and/or total proposal prices as proprietary, or trade secrets, is NOT ACCEPTABLE and may result in REJECTION of the proposal.
- B. As this is a RFP, no information regarding the proposal records or the contents of responses will be released except in accordance with Section 2.2-4342 of the Code of Virginia. Once an award has been made, all proposals will be open to public inspection subject to the provisions set forth above.
- C. **IMPORTANT NOTICE - ADDENDUMS AND NOTICES OF AWARD**

Any interpretation, correction, or change of the RFP will be made by an addendum. The County Purchasing Division or its designee will issue Addenda that will be posted to the County website on the Current Bid Opportunities tab at <https://www.roanokecountyva.gov/bids.aspx>.

Interpretations, corrections or changes of this RFP made in any other manner will not be binding and Offerors must not rely upon such interpretations, corrections, or changes.

Vendors may visit <http://roanokecountyva.gov/list.aspx> to sign up via 'Notify Me' to receive emails or text message notices about bids, proposals, addendums, bid tabulation and awards. Vendors can sign up to receive notification in selected commodity/service categories. It is the vendor's responsibility to keep information

current in the system in order to receive the notifications. The sign up only requires an email address and/or a cell phone number for receiving text messages (if your phone is capable) and your choice of categories. **However, each Offeror is solely responsible for ensuring that such Offeror has the current, complete version of the RFP documents, including any addenda, before submitting a proposal. - D. No Offeror shall confer on any public employee having official responsibility for a purchasing transaction any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit or money, service, or anything of more than nominal value, present or promised, unless consideration of substantially equal or greater value is exchanged.
- E. The County may make investigations to determine the ability of the Offeror to perform or supply the services and/or items as described in this RFP. The County reserves the right to reject any proposal if the Offeror fails to satisfy the County that it is qualified to carry out the obligations of the proposed contract.
- F. The successful Offeror must comply with the nondiscrimination provisions of Virginia Code Section 2.2-4311, which are incorporated herein by reference.
- G. The successful Offeror must comply with the drug-free workplace provisions of Virginia Code Section 2.2-4312, which are incorporated herein by reference.
- H. It is the policy of the County of Roanoke to maximize participation whenever possible by minority and women owned business enterprises in all aspects of County contracting opportunities.
- I. The successful Offeror shall comply with all applicable County, State, and Federal laws, codes, provisions, and regulations. The successful Offeror shall not during the performance of any resultant contract knowingly employ an unauthorized alien as defined in the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.
- J. Providers of any outside services shall be subject to the same conditions and requirements as the successful Offeror in regards to law, code, or regulation compliance. The County reserves the right of approval for any subcontract work, including costs thereof.

- K. Ethics in Public Contracting. The provisions, requirements, and prohibitions as contained in Sections 2.2-4367 through 2.2-4377, of the Virginia Code, pertaining to bidders, offerors, contractors, and subcontractors are applicable to this RFP.
- L. Conflict of Interests Act. The provisions, requirements, and prohibitions as contained in Sections 2.2-3100, et seq., of the Virginia Code are applicable to this RFP.
- M. The procurement provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act as well as the County Procurement Manual, apply to this RFP, unless specifically modified herein. The County's Procurement Manual can be reviewed on the County's electronic procurement website.
- N. Insurance Requirements:  
Successful Offeror, and any of its subcontractors, shall, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain during the life of the resulting Contract the insurance policies and/or bonds required. Any required insurance policies and/or bonds shall be effective prior to the beginning of any work or other performance by successful Offeror, or any of its subcontractors, under any resultant Contract. The policies and coverages required are those as may be referred to in the sample contract and/or the terms and conditions attached to this RFP. All such insurance shall be primary and noncontributory to any insurance or self-insurance the County may have.

## SECTION 5. PROTESTS.

Any Offeror who wishes to protest or object to any award made or other decisions pursuant to this RFP may do so only in accordance with the provisions of Sections 2.2-4357, 4358, 4359, 4360, 4363, and 4364 of the Code of Virginia, and only if such is provided for in such Code section. Any such protest or objection must be in writing signed by a representative of the entity making the protest or objection and contain the information required by the applicable Code Sections set forth above. Such writing must be delivered to the County Purchasing Manager within the required time period.

## SECTION 6. SERVICES AND/OR ITEMS REQUIRED.

A description and/or listing of the services and/or items that the successful Offeror will be required to provide to the County under this RFP are those that are set forth in this RFP below, referred to in any way in the sample contract, in any terms and conditions, and/or in any attachments to this RFP. Each Offeror should carefully read and review all such items and should address such items in its proposal. However, the final description of the services and/or items to be provided to the County under this RFP is subject to negotiations with the successful Offeror, and final approval by the County.

The following are the services and/or items that the successful Offeror will be required to provide to the County, and should be addressed in each Offeror's proposal.

The Contractor shall provide to the Schools high volume copiers, supplies (except paper), training, and maintenance. The Schools provide educational services to approximately 14,000 students who are served in 16 elementary/career center schools, 5 middle/junior high schools, and 6 high/vocational schools. The administrative and support staffs are housed in one central office building. All schools and the central office are currently networked.

Sample yearly volume has been provided for various machines, for your consideration. This listing is not a commitment to contract, but is intended to provide potential Offerors with a representation of annual contract volume. School volumes are seasonal, which means that pricing formulas must be based on annual volumes rather than monthly volumes. The Schools reserve the right to increase or decrease volumes of copiers and/or copies at any time during the period of the contract.

The School Board also reserves the right to cancel the contract at any time without any penalty or additional charges by providing the Contractor with a 24-hour written notice. The Schools will be responsible for charges up to the date of the written notice of cancellation.

Respondents are encouraged to submit proposals that the respondent feels best meets the needs of Roanoke County Public Schools. Respondents may respond on any or all of the sample volume amounts. The County/Schools will make the final determination of the proposal that best meets the needs of Roanoke County Schools.

#### EQUIPMENT

The intent of this proposal is to provide the Schools with a high volume copier program that is cost effective and efficient. The Offeror will recommend the copier equipment to be provided at each location based on volume and standard machine accessories. Digital technology is required for this contract. Any machine not meeting performance requirements, as determined solely by the Copier Maintenance Coordinator (CMC), will be replaced within 24 hours of notification to the Contractor by the CMC.

Copiers may be new, used, re-manufactured, or re-furbished. Acceptability will be determined by performance of the machine based in total on the judgment of the CMC. Your proposal should include the condition of the machines being recommended as new, used, re-manufactured, or re-furbished and to include a definition of the type being offered.

Each Offeror shall indicate if there are restrictions on the type of paper used in its copiers, i.e. recycled bond or 25% cotton. The Schools will not consider machines that do not accept recycled paper as an original and as the paper being copied onto, and laser printer generated originals.

## SUPPLIES

The intent of this proposal is to provide the Schools with high volume copier services. In addition to the use of the machine, charges will include all consumables (except paper), such as, but not limited to, toner, developer, drums, fuser oil, fuser lubricant, fuser agent, cartridges, staples, etc., necessary to operate the machine. All paper will be supplied by the Schools and should not be included in your cost. Supplies that will be loaded by the user, such as toner, are to be delivered to each individual copier site. The Contractor shall maintain ample supply (approximately 30 days) of materials at each copier location. The Contractor will at all times be responsible for maintaining needed inventories, delivering to usage areas and rotating stock, if necessary. Occasional emergency orders may also be required. The Schools prefer regularly scheduled deliveries of supplies but will call if supplies are out or an emergency order is needed. The Schools will provide space for the copiers, electrical power, and paper. All other expenses for the operation are to be the responsibility of the Contractor and shall be included in the proposal. Developer, toner, and other consumables, which are the responsibility of the Contractor's service personnel, will be provided as needed during repair calls or regular preventive maintenance calls. All repair parts, lamps, belts, brushes, rollers, filters, etc., are also to be included. Machines, parts, and all supply items furnished under the contract shall remain the property of the Contractor.

## MAINTENANCE

Qualified Contractor maintenance personnel shall perform equipment maintenance on all copiers and copier accessories during regular school and office hours. Regular hours vary by school, but for high schools are generally 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., middle schools 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and elementary schools 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Access to equipment beyond these hours may be arranged by coordination with school office staff. Regular hours for office locations are generally 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The Contractor is not required to provide services on recognized Schools' holidays. All maintenance personnel will be required to report to the School office before going to any other part of the school.

Service calls will be performed within four working hours of request for maintenance. The maximum allowable downtime for any one copier is two working days during any consecutive thirty-day (calendar) period. Any copier, which cannot be repaired and restored to normal operating service within two days, shall be replaced with a copier of the same or better specifications at no additional cost. Any copier that fails to be operational 95% of the time, computed quarterly, shall be replaced at no additional costs. The percentage shall be calculated by dividing the non-operational days by the number of office days during the quarter. The replacement copier may be a permanent replacement or a "loaner" until the repairs on the original machine is completed. Should the Contractor not replace the copier(s) as specified, the Schools may acquire a replacement and deduct any costs associated therewith from the Contractor's next submitted monthly billing.

For service calls not answered within the four hour established time limit, the Contractor will be assessed a \$30.00 per hour penalty for every hour or part thereof in excess of the four hour term. The penalty amount will appear as a credit on the next statement applicable to the machine in question. Excluded from this requirement are delays resulting from acts of God, accidents, extreme weather conditions, strikes or similar causes. The intention is that the necessary repairs be made. The Contractor may attempt over-the-phone repairs but if unsuccessful, this will not be considered as a substitute for the required four-hour response time. Four-hour response time applies to each service call and will be monitored by the individual school or office location. The Contractor will have recourse to contest such records and will bring any complaints to the attention of the Copier Maintenance Coordinator (CMC) at each location. Preventive maintenance will be according to the Contractor's schedule and the Contractor's discretion. The Contractor's service technicians shall check in and out with the key operator concerned. Each copier will have a permanent record of machine maintenance. The Schools desire that the Contractor develop a reporting process that will provide a maintenance record and a reliability percentage for each machine on a calendar quarterly basis. The Contractor's maintenance personnel shall thoroughly clean up the work area and properly dispose of any residue after each maintenance action.

While the equipment is installed on the premises, the Contractor shall assume all responsibility for loss or damage except that caused by negligence or neglect on the part of the Schools. Repairs caused by negligence or misuse by Schools shall be immediately brought to the attention of the Copier Maintenance Coordinator (CMC). If misuse or negligence is documented and/or obvious, the Contractor shall make repairs under a separate agreement at a negotiated price. The machine may be removed at no charge to the Schools. Compensation, if agreed upon, shall in no event exceed the fair market value of the machine.

#### METER READING AND COPY ALLOWANCE

The Contractor will develop a system of collecting meter readings monthly. The Contractor shall report information monthly to the Copier Maintenance Coordinator (CMC) in a single report. The report should include: School/Office name, location, contact person, copier model, copier ID number and accessories, number of copies made per month and monthly average volume. The Contractor shall modify this report at the request of the CMC.

#### INSTALLATION AND SITE PREPARATION

Any proposed modifications must conform to OSHA requirements, and are subject to Schools approval prior to the placement of any copier at any location. The Contractor is responsible for installation and cost of all modifications. Schools must approve supplies or equipment installed as part of the location's electrical system before any work begins. Such modifications will become the property of Roanoke County Schools.

Installations shall comply with applicable rules of the National Electric Code. All electrical materials shall be UL approved or certified as being in compliance with the rules of the National Electrical Code and meeting or exceeding standards of the Underwriter's Laboratories, Inc. The Schools will not make or allow others to make alterations to the equipment or remove equipment other than as may be authorized by the owner or mutually agreed upon in change of site conditions. Contractor will provide surge protectors. The Schools shall provide correct voltage for all copiers.

#### TRAINING

The Contractor will provide at his/her expense unlimited training required for the operation of any equipment at any site at any time. For locations with a large number of users, the Contractor may use "Key Operator's" concept and specifically train one or more individuals in depth. If a "Key Operator" or other trained personnel should leave a location, the replacement must also be trained in a timely manner. An instructional manual is to be provided with each machine.

#### BILLING

Invoices will be provided monthly to each school or administrative office. A report shall be provided to the Operations Department monthly listing each school and administrative office.

#### AWARD OF CONTRACT AND PERFORMANCE

The Copy Maintenance Coordinator shall have the final decision regarding placement of any copier. New installations will be completed within thirty days maximum after notification of placement approval.

Assuming the contract remains in place for all four (4) renewal years, the Contractor will not be required to place any new machine or replace any existing machine within the last six months of the last year of the contract unless the existing machine has been experiencing an incidence of repair considered prohibitive to the efficiency of the user, in which case the machine will be replaced.

The Contractor will coordinate the installation schedule of copiers with the CMC. All copiers should be installed and required training completed within 30 days of initial order.

The Contractor shall provide one Contract Manager who shall be responsible for the performance of the work. The name of this person and an alternate who shall act for the Contractor when the manager is absent shall be designated in writing as part of this Proposal. The Contract Manager or alternate shall have full authority to act for the Contractor on all contract matters relating to the daily operation of this contract.

The Contract Manager may be required to meet biweekly with the CMC during the first two months of the contract. Meetings thereafter will be as often as Schools deem necessary.



### COPIER INFORMATION

As stated above, the Schools reserve the right to increase or decrease volumes of copiers and/or copies at any time during the period of the contract. The chart below shows the current information about the high volume copiers the Schools have, including the building, machine type, serial number, yearly average and the location within the building.

Please remember that school volumes are seasonal, which means that pricing formulas must be based on annual volumes rather than monthly volumes.

### SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Prices will include shipping, insurance, freight, rigging, initial installation and final removal. During the life of the contract, it may become necessary to move a copier within a location or relocate it on another site. Copiers will not be moved without approval of the Schools' Copy Maintenance Coordinator. Should the Contractor choose to rotate machines to

balance usage or to otherwise move a machine for reasons in his/her own interest, no charges will be assessed to the Schools.

Some users may wish to add options such as feeders, sorters, key counters, etc. which may not be a part of the initial rate. The Schools may add these options at any time during the entire period of the contract. Additional features added for the convenience of the user will be priced at a flat rate per month, in arrears. Technological changes or other such items for which the Schools may have a need and which may become available during the life of the contract will be priced at a flat rate per month based on other government contract pricing (ex: Virginia State Contract or other Government cooperative contract, or negotiated on open market if necessary.)

Changes required to keep the machines at state of the art will be at the expense of the Contractor. Labor involved must be included in any price quoted.

Assuming that the contract remains with one contractor for the entire five-year span, and if any machine shall reach a number of copies in excess of the monthly volume for which it was designed and/or experience an incidence of repair considered prohibitive to the efficiency of the user, the machine shall be replaced. The Contractor may also install an additional copier to equalize the monthly volume. It may also occur that a particular machine may be a "lemon" regardless of manufacturing standards. Any such machine shall be replaced immediately if, in the sole opinion of the County/Schools, it is evident that repair calls are not due to negligence or misuse on the part of the Schools, the Contractors maintenance personnel are unable to resolve the problem and/or the repair frequency is so great as to detract from the intended use of the machine.

## SECTION 7. EVALUATION CRITERIA.

Offerors will be evaluated for selection on the basis of those most qualified to meet the requirements of this RFP. The County of Roanoke does not use a numerical or weighted scoring system when evaluating selection criteria. Major criteria to be considered in the evaluation may include, but shall not necessarily be limited to, the items referred to above and those set forth below:

- A. The background, education and experience of the Offeror in providing similar services or items elsewhere, including the level of experience in working with municipalities and the quality of services performed or items supplied.
- B. Reasonableness/competitiveness of proposed fee and/or benefits to the County, although the County is not bound to select the Offeror who proposes the lowest fees or most benefits for services. The County reserves the right to negotiate fees and/or benefits to the County with the selected Offeror(s).

- C. The Offeror's responsiveness and compliance with the RFP requirements and conditions.
- D. Determination that the selected Offeror has no contractual relationships which would result in a conflict of interest with the County's contract.
- E. The Offeror's ability, capacity and skill to fully and satisfactorily provide the services and/or items required in this RFP.
- F. The quality of Offeror's performance in comparable and/or similar projects.
- G. Whether the Offeror can provide the services and/or deliver the items in a prompt and timely fashion, to include service response time.
- H. Offeror's willingness to accept the County's sample contract (Attachment A).
- I. Proposed equipment and features available.

## SECTION 8. SELECTION PROCESS.

- A. Pursuant to Section 2.2-4302.2 (A)(4) of the Code of Virginia, selection of the Offeror will be as follows:
  - 1. The County's designee, shall engage in individual discussions with two or more Offerors, if there be that many deemed fully qualified, responsible and suitable on the basis of initial responses with emphasis on professional competence to provide the required services. Repetitive informal interviews shall be permissible. Such Offerors shall be encouraged to elaborate on their qualifications and performance data or staff expertise pertinent to the proposed projects as well as alternative concepts. These discussions may encompass nonbinding estimates of total project costs including, where appropriate, design, construction, life cycle cost, nonbinding estimates of price for services, and other matters. Methods to be utilized in arriving at a price for services may also be discussed. Properly designated proprietary information from competing Offerors shall not be disclosed to the public or competitors, except as may be required by law.
  - 2. At the conclusion of discussions, outlined in the paragraph above, on the basis of evaluation factors published in the RFP and all information developed in the selection process to this point, the two (2) or more Offerors whose professional qualifications and proposed services are deemed most meritorious shall be ranked in order of preference.

3. Negotiations shall then be conducted, beginning with the Offeror ranked first. If a contract satisfactory and advantageous to the County can be negotiated at a price considered fair and reasonable, the award shall be made to that Offeror. Otherwise, negotiations with the Offeror ranked first shall be formally terminated and negotiations conducted with the Offeror ranked second, and so on until such a contract can be negotiated at a fair and reasonable price. Should the County determine in writing and in its sole discretion that only one Offeror is fully qualified, or that one Offeror is clearly more highly qualified than the others under consideration, a contract may be negotiated and awarded to that Offeror.
- B. All proposals submitted in response to this RFP will be reviewed by the Purchasing Division or its designee for responsiveness prior to referral to a selection committee or person. A committee consisting of County personnel and/or others and/or an appropriate individual will then evaluate all responsive proposals, conduct the negotiations, and make recommendations to the County as appropriate. The award of a contract, if made, will be made to the Offeror whose proposal best furthers the interest of the County. The County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, to waive any informality or irregularity in the proposals received, and to make the award to the Offeror whose proposal is deemed to be in the best interest of the County.
- C. Oral Presentation: Offerors who submit a proposal in response to this RFP may be required to give an oral presentation of their proposal to the selection committee or person. This provides an opportunity for the Offeror to clarify or elaborate on the proposal. This is a fact finding and explanation session only and does not include negotiation. Oral presentations are strictly at the option of the County and may or may not be conducted.
- D. The County reserves the right to make multiple awards as a result of this solicitation.

## SECTION 9. COOPERATIVE PROCUREMENT.

The procurement of goods and/or services provided for in this Contract is being conducted pursuant to Virginia Code Section 2.2-4304 and on behalf of other public bodies in Virginia. Unless specifically prohibited by the Awarded Offeror, any resultant contract may be used by other public bodies in Virginia as allowed by Section 2.2-4304. The Awarded Offeror shall deal directly with each public agency or body seeking to obtain any goods and/or services pursuant to this Contract or from this procurement and in accordance with Virginia Code Section 2.2-4304. The County of Roanoke shall not be responsible or liable for any costs, expenses, or any other matters of any type to either the Contractor or the public agency or body seeking to obtain any goods and/or services pursuant to this cooperative procurement provision.

## SECTION 10. INFORMATION ON CONTRACT TO BE AWARDED.

The Sample Contract marked as Attachment A to RFP # 2020-074 contains terms and conditions that the County will include in any contract that may be awarded, but such terms and conditions may be changed, added to, deleted, or modified as may be agreed to between the County and the Offeror during negotiations. However, if an Offeror has any objections to any of the terms or conditions set forth in the Sample Contract or any changes or additions thereto that the Offeror wants to discuss during negotiations, the Offeror should set forth such objections, changes, or additions in such Offeror's proposal submitted in response to this RFP. Otherwise, submission of a proposal by an Offeror will obligate such Offeror, if it is the successful Offeror, to enter into a contract containing the same or substantially similar terms and conditions as contained in such Sample Contract. Other terms and conditions, if necessary, will be negotiated with the successful Offeror.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Contractor has been awarded this nonexclusive Contract by the County for furnishing all equipment, materials, goods, labor, and services necessary for high volume copier services and associated work in accordance with this Contract and the documents referred to herein, all such items or services also being referred to hereinafter as the Work or Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY AND THE CONTRACTOR AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1. WORK TO BE PERFORMED AND DOCUMENTS.**

For and in consideration of the money hereinafter specified to be paid by the County to the Contractor for the Work provided for in this Contract to be performed by the Contractor, the Contractor hereby covenants and agrees with the County to fully perform the services, provide any materials called for to construct, and complete the Work called for by this Contract in a good and workmanlike manner in accordance with this Contract and the documents referred to herein in order to fully and properly complete this Contract within the time stipulated, time being made of the essence for this Contract. It is also agreed by the parties hereto that the documents to this Contract consist of this Contract and the following documents listed below (Contract Documents), all of which are and constitute a part of this Contract as if attached hereto or set out in full herein, viz:

1. Insurance Requirements (Exhibit 1).
2. Scope of Work/Fee Schedule (Exhibit 2).
3. List of Locations (Exhibit 3).
4. Request for Proposal No. 2020-074, which is incorporated herein by reference.

The parties agree that if there are any differences between the provisions of the above referenced documents, the provisions of the County documents and this Contract will control over any Contractor supplied documents or information.

## **SECTION 2. CONTRACT AMOUNT.**

The County agrees to pay the Contractor for the Contractor's complete and satisfactory performance of the Work, in the manner and at the time set out in this Contract, but the total amount for all such requests will not exceed \$ \_\_\_\_\_, as provided for in this Contract and that this Contract amount may be increased or decreased by additions and/or reductions in the Work as may be authorized and approved by the County, and the Contract amount may be decreased by the County's assessment of any damages against the Contractor, as may be provided for in this Contractor or by law, and the County retains the right of setoff as to any amounts of money the Contractor may owe the County. However, Contractor further acknowledges and agrees that any request for Contractor to perform Work under this Contract is in the sole discretion of the County and that there is no guarantee of any minimum amount of Work that may be requested by the County and that no Work may be requested.

## **SECTION 3. TERM OF CONTRACT.**

- A. The term of this Contract shall be for one (1) year, from July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2021, at which time it will terminate, unless sooner terminated pursuant to the terms of the Contract or by law or unless extended as set forth herein at the option of the County.
- B. By mutual agreement of the parties, the contract may be renewed for up to four (4) additional one (1) year periods of any combination thereof. If either party wants to renew the Contract that party shall give a written request to renew to the other party before the expiration of the original term or any renewal term of the Contract. The party receiving such request shall either accept or reject in writing such request within ten (10) days of receipt of that request, provided, however, if the party receiving the request to renew fails to respond within ten (10) days, the request to renew shall be deemed to be rejected, unless the parties mutually agree otherwise.
- C. All terms and conditions shall remain in force for the term of this Contract and for any renewal period unless modified by mutual agreement of both parties. Prices shall not be increased during the initial term of this Contract.

## **SECTION 4. TIME OF PERFORMANCE.**

The Contractor shall commence the Work to be performed under this Contract on such date as is established and fixed for such commencement by written notice (which may be initially given verbally in an emergency situation) to proceed given by the County representative to the Contractor, and the Contractor covenants and agrees to fully construct, perform, and complete the Work and/or provide the goods called for by this Contract established by such

notice. The Contractor further agrees that the Work shall be started promptly upon receipt of such notice and shall be prosecuted regularly, diligently, and uninterruptedly at a rate of progress that will ensure full completion thereof in the shortest length of time consistent with the Contract Documents and that Contractor will cooperate and coordinate with the other County contractors or employees doing other work or using the area where Contractor is working.

## **SECTION 5. PAYMENT.**

- A. The County and Contractor agree that the County will only pay the Contractor for time actually spent and materials actually provided on the Project requested and accepted by the County. Invoices for services rendered and accepted shall be submitted by Contractor directly to the payment address of the requesting County department/division. Payment of such invoices shall be the responsibility of the department/division.
- B. The County agrees to pay Contractor for the Contractor's complete and satisfactory performance of the Work, in the manner and at the time set out in this Contract. The County retains the right to setoff as to any amounts of money Contractor may owe the County. A written progress report may be requested by the County to accompany payment request and, if so, such progress report shall detail the work completed. Also, sufficient documentation of all costs, expenses, materials supplies, and/or hours worked may be requested by the County and, if so, may be required prior to the processing of any such request for payment. Payment will only be made for work actually performed, services actually supplied, and/or materials or goods furnished to the County, all of which need to be approved and accepted by the County prior to such payment, unless otherwise provided for in the Contract documents. Once a payment request has been received the County, the County will process such payment request. If there are any objections or problems with the payment request, the County will notify the Contractor of such matters. If the payment request is approved and accepted by the County, payment will be made by the County to the Contractor not more than 30 days after such request has been approved.

### **OR**

- A. The County and Contractor agree that the County will only pay the Contractor for time actually spent and materials actually provided on the Project requested and accepted by the County. The payment requested shall be for the services completed and/or materials supplied for the Project, as specified in the Scope of Work (Exhibit 2) and as approved by the Requesting County Department. A written progress report detailing work completed, identified problems, and remaining work shall accompany each request for payment, together with sufficient documentation of all reimbursable expenses or costs.
- B. Also, sufficient documentation of all costs, expenses, materials supplied, and/or hours worked may be requested by the County and, if so, may be required prior to the processing of any such request for payment. Payment will only be made for work



actually performed, services actually supplied, and/or materials or goods furnished to the County, all of which need to be approved and accepted by the County prior to such payment, unless otherwise provided for in the Contract documents. Invoices for work rendered and accepted shall be submitted by Contractor directly to the Requesting County Department. Approval and payment of such invoices shall be the responsibility of the Requesting County Department or designee. Once a payment request has been received by the County, the County will process such payment request. If there are any objections or problems with the payment request, the County will notify the Contractor of such matters. If the payment request is approved and accepted by the County, payment will be made by the County to the Contractor not more than 30 days after such request has been approved.

- C. The services the Contractor may be requested to provide the County are those items set forth in Exhibit 2 (Scope of Work) and/or Exhibit 3 (Bid Form), which list of services may be amended by the mutual agreement of the parties. The prices to be paid to the Contractor for such services provided to and accepted by the County under the provisions of this Contract shall be the current price(s) as set forth in Exhibit 3 (Bid Form). Unless otherwise stated in this Contract, the price(s) shall include all applicable charges such as pick up, delivery, printing, packaging, shipping, and other charges.

#### **SECTION 6. SALES TAX EXEMPTION.**

The County is exempt from payment of State Sales and Use Tax on all tangible personal property purchased or leased for the County's use or consumption. The Virginia Sales and Use Tax Certificate of Exemption number is 217-074292-9. This tax exempt status does not transfer to the Contractor for any taxes associated with the work under this Contract.

#### **SECTION 7. FREE ON BOARD, RISK OF LOSS, AND TITLE.**

All prices include F.O.B Destination, inside delivery, unless otherwise noted in this Contract. The risk of loss from any casualty, regardless of cause, shall be on the Contractor until the items have been delivered to County personnel making the request and accepted by the County. The risk of loss shall also be on the Contractor during the return of any items to the Contractor. Title to the items shall pass to the County upon receipt and acceptance of such items by the County.

#### **SECTION 8. INSPECTION.**

The County shall have a reasonable time after receipt of items and before payment to inspect all items for conformity to this Contract. If all or some of the items delivered to the County do not fully conform to the provisions hereof, the County shall have the right to reject and return such nonconforming items, at the sole cost of the Contractor.

#### **SECTION 9. WARRANTY OF MATERIAL AND WORKMANSHIP.**

Contractor agrees that all items provided to the County will be new, or if an item is refurbished or remanufactured, such item will meet the industry standards for such item and the item shall be clearly labeled as refurbished or remanufactured, and that all such items include such warranties as may be provided by Virginia law together with any warranties provided by the manufacturer of the item. Contractor shall use reasonable commercial efforts to assist the County in processing warranty claims against a manufacturer. Contractor also agrees that the services provided under this Contract shall be completed in a professional, good and workmanlike manner, with the degree of skill and care that is required by like contractors in Virginia. Further, Contractor warrants that such services shall be completed in accordance with the applicable requirements of this Contract and shall be correct and appropriate for the purposes contemplated in this Contract. Contractor agrees that Contractor shall repair or replace, at Contractor's sole expense, and to the satisfaction of the County, any items, material, equipment, or part of the item that is found by the County to be defective or not in accordance with the terms of this Contract.

#### **SECTION 10. PAYMENTS TO OTHERS BY CONTRACTOR.**

The Contractor agrees that Contractor will comply with the requirements of Section 2.2-4354 of the Virginia Code regarding Contractor's payment to other entities and the Contractor will take one of the two actions permitted therein within 7 days after receipt of amounts paid to Contractor by the County. Contractor further agrees that the Contractor shall indemnify and hold the County harmless for any lawful claims resulting from the failure of the Contractor to make prompt payments to all persons supplying the Contractor equipment, labor, tools, or material in connection with the work provided for in the Contract. In the event of such claims, the County may, in the County's sole discretion, after providing written notice to the Contractor, withhold from any payment request or final payment the unpaid sum of money deemed sufficient to pay all appropriate claims and associated costs in connection with the Contract and make such payment, if the County determines it to be appropriate to do so.

#### **SECTION 11. HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY.**

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers, agents, and employees against any and all liability, losses, damages, claims, causes of action, suits of any nature, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, resulting from or arising out the negligence acts or omissions of Contractor, or its employees, agents, assigns or subcontractors on or near County's property or arising in any way out of or resulting from any of the work or items to be provided under this Contract, and this includes, without limitation, any fines or penalties, violations of federal, state, or local laws or regulations, personal injury, wrongful death, or property damage claims or suits. Contractor agrees to and shall protect, indemnify, and hold harmless all the parties referred to above from any and all demands for fees, claims, suits, actions, causes of action, settlement or judgments based on the alleged or actual infringement or violation of any copyright, trademark, patent, invention, article, arrangement, or other apparatus that may be used in the performance of this Contract.

#### **SECTION 12. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS, AND IMMIGRATION LAW.**

Contractor agrees to and will comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations, including, but not limited to all applicable licensing requirements, environmental regulations, and OSHA regulations. Contractor further agrees that Contractor does not and shall not during the performance of its Contract, knowingly employ an unauthorized alien as defined in the Federal Immigration Reform & Control Act of 1986.

### **SECTION 13. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR.**

The relationship between Contractor and the County is a contractual relationship. It is not intended in any way to create a legal agency or employment relationship. Contractor shall, at all times, maintain its status as an independent contractor and both parties acknowledge that neither is an agent, partner or employee of the other for any purpose. Contractor shall be responsible for causing all required insurance, workers' compensation (regardless of number of employees) and unemployment insurance to be provided for all of its employees and subcontractors. Contractor will be responsible for all actions of any of its subcontractors, and that they are properly licensed.

### **SECTION 14. REPORTS, RECORDS, AND AUDIT.**

Contractor agrees to maintain all books, records, electronic data, and other documents relating to this Contract for a period of five (5) years after the end of each fiscal year included in this Contract. The County, its authorized employees, agents, representatives, and/or state auditors shall have full access to and the right to request, examine, copy, and/or audit any such materials during the term of the Contract and such retention period, upon prior written notice to Contractor. This includes the County's right to audit and/or examine any of the Contractor's documents and/or data as the County deems appropriate to protect the County's interests.

### **SECTION 15. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.**

Contractor and any of its subcontractors for this Contract shall maintain the insurance coverage's set forth in Exhibit 1 to this Contract and provide the proof of such insurance coverage set forth in Exhibit 1, including workers' compensation coverage regardless of the number of Contractor's employees. Such insurance coverage shall be obtained at the Contractor's sole expense and maintained during the life of the Contract and shall be effective prior to the beginning of any work or other performance by the Contractor under this Contract. Additional insured endorsements, if required, must be received by the County within 30 days of the execution of this Contract or as otherwise required by the County's Risk Manager.

### **SECTION 16. DEFAULT.**

If Contractor fails or refuses to perform any of the terms of this Contract, which includes providing poor services, work or materials, the County may, by written notice to Contractor, terminate this Contract in whole or in part. In addition to any right to terminate, the County may enforce any remedy available at law or in equity in connection with such default, and Contractor shall be liable for any damages to the County resulting from Contractor's default. The County further reserves the right to immediately obtain such work or services from other entities in the event of Contractor's default.

#### **SECTION 17. NONWAIVER.**

Contractor agrees that the County's waiver or failure to enforce or require performance of any term or condition of this Contract or the County's waiver of any particular breach of this Contract by the Contractor extends to that instance only. Such waiver or failure is not and shall not be a waiver of any of the terms or conditions of this Contract or a waiver of any other breaches of the Contract by the Contractor and does not bar the County from requiring the Contractor to comply with all the terms and conditions of the Contract, and further does not bar the County from asserting any and all rights and/or remedies it has or might have against the Contractor under this Contract or by law.

#### **SECTION 18. FORUM SELECTION AND CHOICE OF LAW.**

This Contract shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, without application of Virginia's conflict of law provisions. Venue for any litigation, suits, and claims arising from or connected with this Contract shall only be proper in the Roanoke County Circuit Court, or in the Roanoke County General District Court if the amount in controversy is within the jurisdictional limit of such court, and all parties to this Contract voluntarily submit themselves to the jurisdiction and venue of such courts, regardless of the actual location of such parties. The provisions of this Contract shall not be construed in favor of or against either party, but shall be construed according to their fair meaning as if both parties jointly prepared this Contract.

#### **SECTION 19. SEVERABILITY.**

If any provision of this Contract, or the application of any provision hereof to a particular entity or circumstance, shall be held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Contract shall not be affected and all other terms and conditions of this Contract shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

#### **SECTION 20. NONDISCRIMINATION.**

- A. During the performance of this Contract, Contractor agrees as follows:
  - i. Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in

employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the Contractor. Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

- ii. Contractor in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Contractor will state that Contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
- iii. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting the requirements of this section.

- B. Contractor will include the provisions of the foregoing Section A (i, ii, and iii) in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

## **SECTION 21. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE.**

- A. During the performance of this Contract, Contractor agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for Contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of Contractor that Contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.
- B. For the purposes of this section, "drug-free workplace" means a site for the performance of work done in connection with a specific contract awarded to a contractor, the employees of whom are prohibited from engaging in the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of any controlled substance or marijuana during the performance of the contract.

## **SECTION 22. FAITH BASED ORGANIZATIONS.**

Pursuant to Virginia Code Section 2.2-4343.1, be advised that the County does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.

## **SECTION 23. DATA ON CONVICTIONS FOR CERTAIN CRIMES AND CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT CERTIFICATION OF CONTRACTOR**

The Contractor certifies that none of the persons who will provide services requiring direct contact with students on school property during school hours or during school-sponsored

activities has been convicted of any of the following felony or misdemeanor offenses: felony sex or violence offenses; other felony offenses or misdemeanor sex offenses within the past ten years.

The Contractor further understands and acknowledges (1) that if he or his agents makes a materially false statement regarding any of the above offenses, he will be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor and may forfeit profits derived from the contract. Further, the Contractor understands and acknowledges that before any person is permitted to provide such services subsequent to this certification, he must complete a new certification regarding such person in a form satisfactory to Roanoke County and the Roanoke County School Board. Data and Conviction information will be requested before the County of Roanoke/Schools enters into a contract / when required.

#### **SECTION 24. ASSIGNMENT.**

Contractor may not assign or transfer this Contract in whole or in part except with the prior written consent of the County. If consent to assign is given, no such assignment shall in any way release or relieve the Contractor from any of the covenants or undertakings contained in this Contract and the Contractor shall remain liable for the Contract during the entire term thereof.

#### **SECTION 25. CONTRACTUAL DISPUTES.**

Contractual claims, whether for money or for other relief, including any disputes as to change orders or extra work, shall be submitted, in writing, no later than sixty (60) calendar days after final payment or payment designated as a final payment; however, written notice of the Contractor's intention to file such claim must be given at the time of the occurrence or beginning of the work upon which the claim is based. Such notice is a condition precedent to the assertion of any such claim by the Contractor. A written decision upon any such claims will be made by the Board of Supervisors or its designee (hereafter "BOS"). The Contractor may not institute legal action prior to receipt of the County's decision on the claim unless the BOS fails to render such decision within ninety one hundred twenty (90) calendar days from submittal of its claim. The decision of the BOS shall be final and conclusive unless the Contractor within six (6) months of the date of the final decision on a claim or from expiration of the 90 day time limit, whichever occurs first, initiates legal action as provided in Section 2.2-4364 of the Code of Virginia. Failure of the County to render a decision within said ninety (90) calendar days shall not result in the Contractor being awarded the relief claimed nor shall it result in any other relief or penalty. The sole result of the County's failure to render a decision within said ninety (90) calendar days shall be Contractor's right to immediately institute legal action. No administrative appeals procedure pursuant to Section 2.2-4365 of the Code of Virginia has been established for contractual claims under this Contract.

#### **SECTION 26. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS.**

The terms, conditions, provisions, and undertakings of this Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

**SECTION 27. HEADINGS.**

The captions and headings in this Contract are for convenience and reference purposes only and shall not affect in any way the meaning and interpretation of this Contract.

**SECTION 28. COUNTERPART COPIES.**

This Contract may be executed in any number of counterpart copies, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute a single instrument.

**SECTION 29. AUTHORITY TO SIGN.**

The persons who have executed this Contract represent and warrant that they are duly authorized to execute this Contract on behalf of the party for whom they are signing.

**SECTION 30. NOTICES.**

All notices must be given in writing and shall be deemed valid if sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by a nationally recognized overnight courier, with a receipt, addressed as follows (or any other address that the party to be notified may have designated to the sender by like notice):

Notices shall be deemed to be effective one day after sending if sent by overnight courier or three (3) days after sending it by certified mail, return receipt requested.

### **SECTION 31. PROTECTING PERSONS AND PROPERTY.**

The Contractor expressly undertakes both directly and through its subcontractors, to take every reasonable precaution at all times for the protection of all persons and property at the location of the Work or in the vicinity of the Work or that may be affected by the Contractor's operation in connection with the Work. The Contractor will maintain adequate protection of all Contractor's Work to prevent damage to it and shall protect the County's property from any injury or loss arising in connection with this Contract and to protect adjacent property to prevent any damage to it or loss of use and enjoyment by its owners. Contractor agrees to be responsible for the entire Work and will be liable for all damages to the Work, including, but not limited to, damages to any property of the County or to any property in the vicinity or adjacent to the Work. All damage with respect to the Work caused by vandalism, weather, or any other cause, other than resulting from the sole negligence of the County shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. Contractor shall also be responsible for any inventory shortages and discrepancies of any type.

### **SECTION 32. CONTRACT SUBJECT TO FUNDING.**

This Contract is subject to funding and/or appropriations from federal, state, and/or local governments and/or agencies. If any such funding is not provided, withdrawn, or otherwise not made available for this Contract, the Contractor agrees that the County may terminate this Contract on seven (7) days written notice to Contractor, without any penalty or damages being incurred by the County. Contractor further agrees to comply with any applicable requirements of any grants and/or agreements providing such funding.

### **SECTION 33. SUSPENSION OR TERMINATION OF CONTRACT BY COUNTY.**

The County, at any time, may order Contractor to immediately stop work on this Contract, and/or by seven days (7) written notice may terminate this Contract, with or without cause, in whole or in part, at any time. Upon receipt of such notice, the Contractor shall immediately discontinue all services affected (unless the notice directs otherwise), and deliver to the County all data (including electronic data), drawings, specifications, reports, project deliverables, estimates, summaries, and such other information and materials as may have been accumulated by the Contractor in performing this Contract whether completed or in process (unless otherwise directed by the notice).

1. If the termination or stop work order is due to the failure of the Contractor to fulfill any of its Contract obligations, the County may take over the Work and prosecute the same to completion by contract or otherwise. In such case, the Contractor shall be liable to the County for any damages allowed by law, and upon demand of County shall promptly pay the same to County.



2. Should the Contract be terminated or work is stopped not due in any way to the fault of the Contractor, the Contractor shall only be entitled to compensation for services actually performed and materials actually supplied prior to notice of termination or to stop work and which are approved by the County and any applicable federal or state approving agency. No profit, overhead, or any other costs of any type are allowed after the date of such notice of termination or stop work order.
3. The rights and remedies of the County provided in this Section are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under this Contract and County may pursue any and all such rights and remedies against Contractor as it deems appropriate.

#### **SECTION 34. ETHICS IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING.**

The provisions, requirements, and prohibitions as contained in Sections 2.2–4367 through 2.2-4377, of the Va. Code, pertaining to bidders, offerors, contractors, and subcontractors are applicable to this Contract.

#### **SECTION 35. COMPLIANCE WITH STATE LAW; FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC BUSINESSES AUTHORIZED TO TRANSACT BUSINESS IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF VIRGINIA.**

Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Virginia Code Section 2.2-4311.2, as amended, which provides that a contractor organized as a stock or nonstock corporation, limited liability company, business trust, or limited partnership or registered as a registered limited liability partnership shall be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a domestic or foreign business entity if so required by Title 13.1 or Title 50 or as otherwise required by law. Contractor shall not allow its existence to lapse or its certificate of authority or registration to transact business in the Commonwealth, if so required under Title 13.1 or Title 50, to be revoked or cancelled at any time during the term of the Contract. The County may void the Contract if the Contractor fails to remain in compliance with the provisions of this section.

#### **SECTION 36. OWNERSHIP OF REPORTS AND DOCUMENTS.**

Contractor agrees that all reports and any other documents (including electronic data) prepared for, obtained in connection with, and/or required to be produced in connection with this Contract shall be delivered by the Contractor to the County and all such items shall become the sole property of the County. The Contractor agrees that the County shall own all rights of any type in and to all such items, including but not limited to copyrights and trademarks, and the County may reproduce, copy, and use all such items as the County deems appropriate, without any restriction or limitation on their use and without any cost or charges to the County from Contractor. Contractor hereby transfers and assigns all such rights and items to the County. Contractor further agrees Contractor will take any action and

execute any documents necessary to accomplish the provisions of this Section. The Contractor also warrants that Contractor has good title to all materials, equipment, documents, and supplies which it uses in the Work or for which it accepts payment in whole or in part.

**INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS SECTION**

The Contractor shall comply with the insurance requirements set forth in the Contract, including the items set forth below:

- A. Neither the Contractor nor any subcontractor shall commence work under this Contract until the Contractor has obtained and provided proof of the required insurance coverages to the County, and such proof has been approved by the County. The Contractor confirms to the County that all subcontractors have provided Contractor with proof of such insurance, or will do so prior to commencing any work under this Contract.
- B. Contractor, including all subcontractors, shall, at its and/or their sole expense, obtain and maintain during the life of this Contract the insurance policies and/or coverages required by this section. The County and its officers, employees, agents, assigns, and volunteers shall be added as an additional insured to the general liability and automobile coverages of any such policies and such insurance coverages shall be primary and noncontributory to any insurance and/or self-insurance such additional insureds may have. The Contractor shall immediately notify in writing the County of any changes, modifications, and/or termination of any insurance coverages and/or policies required by this Contract. The Contractor shall provide to the County with the signed Contract an Acord certificate of insurance which states in the description of operations section one of the two paragraphs below:
  - (1) The County and its officers, employees, agents, assigns, and volunteers are additional insureds as coverage under this policy includes ISO endorsement CG 20 33 which provides that the insured status of such entities is automatic if required by a contract or a written agreement. (If additional insured status is automatic under a different coverage form, Contractor must attach a copy of the coverage form to its certificate. Any required insurance policies shall be effective prior to the beginning of any work or other performance by Contractor and any subcontractors under this Contract).

OR

- (2) ISO endorsement CG 20 10 will be issued, prior to the beginning of any work or other performance by Contractor under this Contract, to the County and its officers, employees, agents, assigns, and volunteers naming them as an additional insured under the general liability coverage. (A copy of the binder confirming the issuance must be attached to the certificate. Any required insurance policies shall be effective prior to the beginning of any work or other performance by Contractor and any subcontractors under this Contract).

However, if B (1) or (2) cannot be provided, the County's Risk Manager, in such Manager's sole discretion, may approve such other certificate of insurance or insurance document(s) that the Risk Manager deems acceptable. The County of Roanoke shall also be named as the Certificate Holder.

C. **The following insurance coverages and limits are required in order to provide services or materials to Roanoke County general government agencies and the Roanoke County Public Schools. These limits may be adjusted depending on the type of service or materials being provided and the exposure to risk.**

The Successful Offeror shall carry Liability Insurance in the amount specified below, including contractual liability assumed by the Successful Offeror, and shall deliver a Certificate of Insurance from carriers acceptable to the owner specifying such limits. The Certificate shall show the County of Roanoke and Roanoke County Public Schools, their supervisory boards and members thereof, officers, agents, employees and volunteers as an additional insureds on the Commercial General Liability, Automobile Liability and Excess/Umbrella Liability coverage. The additional insured status shall be endorsed to the coverage with the provision that this coverage "is primary to all other coverage the County of Roanoke and/or Roanoke County Public Schools may possess." A Certificate of Insurance evidencing the additional insured status must be presented to the County of Roanoke and/or Roanoke County Public Schools along with a copy of the Endorsement prior to work or services beginning.

The coverage shall be provided by a carrier(s) rated "Excellent" by A.M. Best. In addition, the insurer shall agree to give the County 30 days' notice of its decision to cancel coverage.

Contractual Liability covers the following indemnity agreement: "The Successful Offeror agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County of Roanoke and Roanoke County Public Schools, their supervisory boards and members thereof, officers, agents, employees and volunteers from any claims, damages, suits, actions, liabilities and costs of any kind or nature, including attorneys' fees, arising from or caused by the provision of any services, the failure to provide any services or the use of any services or materials furnished (or made available) by the Successful Offeror, provided that such liability is not attributable to the County or School Division's sole negligence."
- E. The classification code numbers appearing on the Commercial General Liability coverage parts shall not exclude the symbols "X-C-U".
- F. The intent of this insurance specification is to provide the coverage required and the limits expected for each type of coverage. With regard to the Business Automobile Liability and Commercial General Liability, the total amount of coverage can be accomplished through any combination of primary and excess/umbrella insurance. However, the total insurance protection provided for Commercial General Liability or for Business Automobile Liability, either individually or in combination with the Excess/Umbrella Liability, must total \$1,000,000 per occurrence. This insurance shall apply as primary insurance with respect to any other insurance or self-insurance programs afforded the County of Roanoke and Roanoke County Public Schools. This policy shall be endorsed to be primary with respect to the additional insured.
